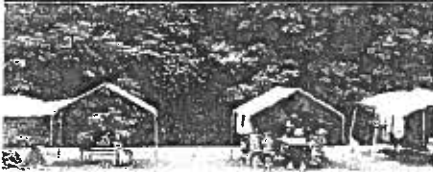

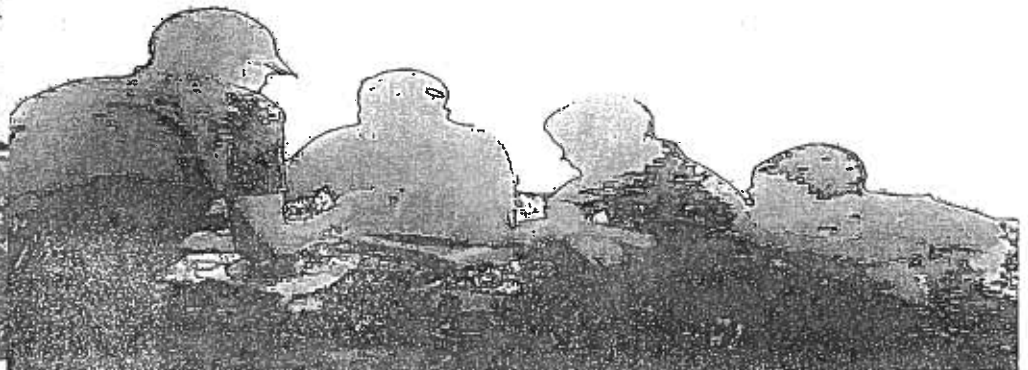


Fun in the Sun

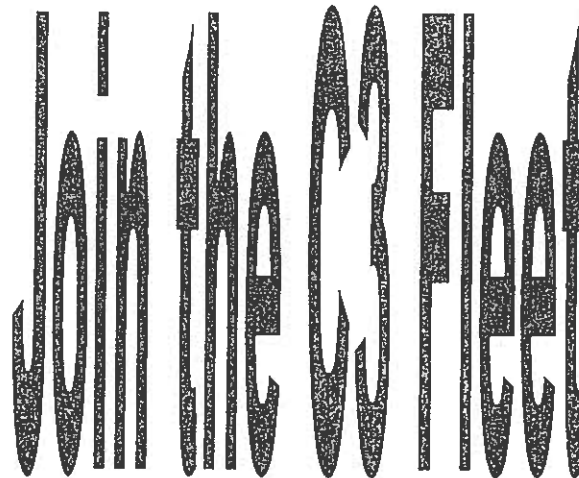

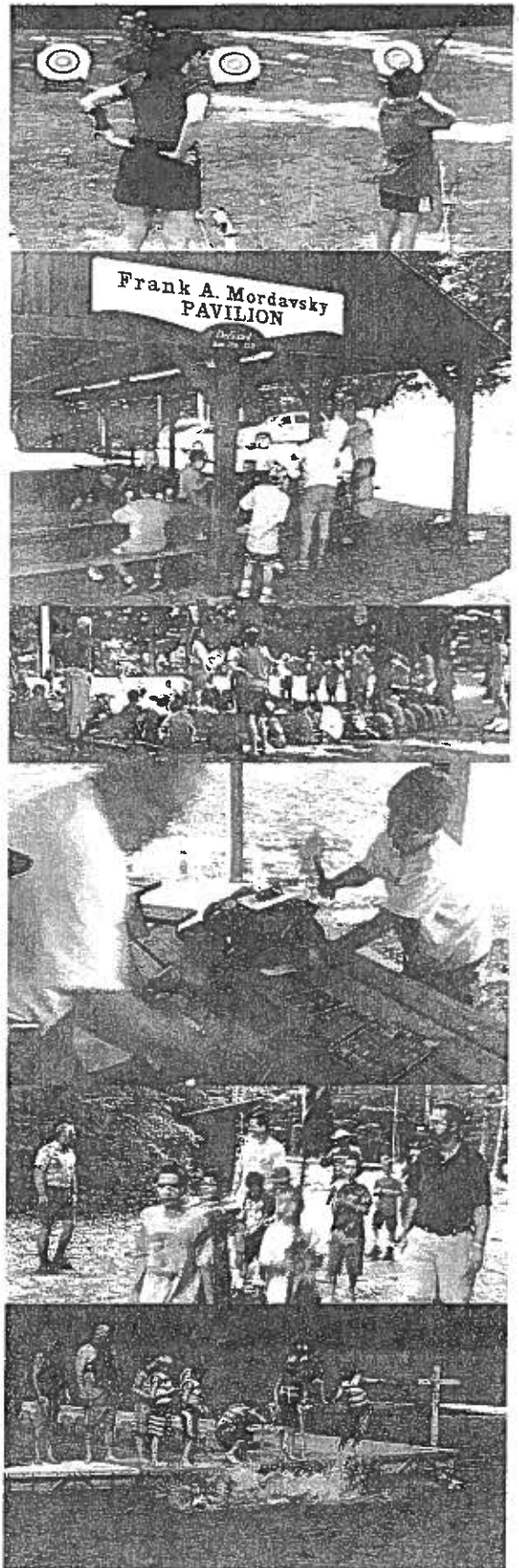

Webelos Resident — This overnight week long camping experience is for Webelos. Activities are programmed to help Webelos age Cub Scouts with the achievements of their rank.

Cub Adventure — This week long overnight experience is for Bears and Wolves. Programming is appropriate for boys entering the second or third grade.

Cub Experience — A shorter overnite experience to introduce a Cub Scout to overnight resident camping. **Cub/Family Overnite** — is for the Cub Scout and adult partner. This one night stay at camp gives a Cub Scout a sampling of what resident camp is like. Other family members may join in all the full at camp. **Day Camp** — is run during the week at convenient locations. Younger boys enjoy the Cub Scout experience without the overnight element. Many boys try the Cub Scout Summer Experience at day camp before moving on the resident camp experience. **Twilight camp** — is programmed for the family. Scheduled in the evening after regular working hours, families come and have a picnic then take part in the camp activities. It's a way to interact with your Cub Scout in the busy summer months.



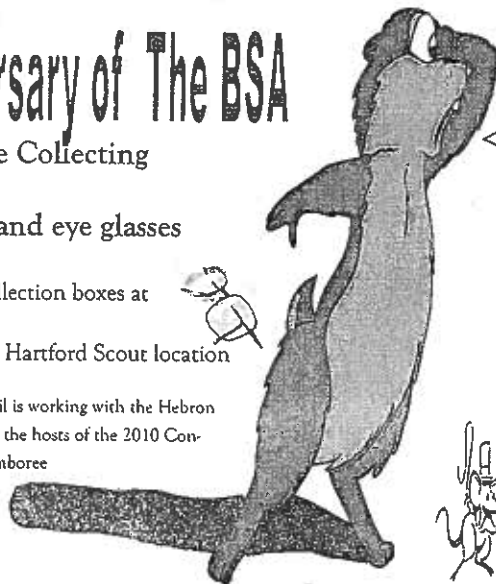
